

### Highlights



#### **National Level**

- U.S. EPA released the National Recycling Strategy
- Set goal of 50% diversion by 2030
- Investment in infrastructure
- and recycling value increased since National Sword SWANA survey new recycling capacity – additional 15 paper mills

#### State Level

- Materials Management Advisory Committee Recommendations
- Landfill diversion targets 40% by 2025; 45% by 2030 and 50% by 2035
- Increase state investment into recycling and composting
- Develop data management systems for measuring diversion







- 15 community special collections collected various items including items such as paint, electronics, eyeglasses, flags, bikes, paper (for shredding) and propane tanks





- 69,980 gallons collected
- Increase of 399 vehicles and 3,875 from 2020

- 21% increase in lbs. from 2020
- Collected more than 1.4 million lbs.


