- A-1. Throughout the reporting period, staff attended and participated in area meetings which discuss and educate ways to reduce and minimize pollutants in stormwater run-off.

Our office continues to be a member of the DuPage River Salt Creek Workgroup, an organization that helps determine stresses to the aquatic systems and addresses water quality issues. They develop and implement quality monitoring programs and viable remediation projects.

The Highway Department mailed our annual 2017 Spring/Summer newsletter to approximately 3300 residents. A portion of the newsletter is dedicated to “Sustainable Options” and promotes the DuPage River Sweep event that removes trash and debris from our local waterways.

We promote and share ideas about “Earth-Friendly Landscaping” in our newsletter.

Our newsletter also encourages residents to purchase a rain barrel through the Conservation Foundation for their home. Rain barrels catch rainwater and help reduce flooding and stress on sewer system’s infrastructure in addition to helping keep pollutants out of our rivers and streams.
